



Education Research Guide for Faculty

This research guide is designed to help you get started finding books from the library's catalog and articles from different types of education related periodicals (journals, newspapers, magazines). It contains a list of suggested subject headings and keywords to be used when searching the online databases available through your Delaware Tech library as well as relevant Websites.

The library's online catalog, the Delaware Library Catalog, is a database used to locate books from not only the college but from many other libraries in the catalog. A description of two database services will be discussed in this guide, EBSCOhost and Lexis Nexis. All of these databases can be accessed both on and off-campus.



Accessing the **Delaware Library Catalog**, **Lexis Nexis** or **EBSCOhost** from your office is as easy as accessing them in the library. Go to the Delaware Tech **myDTCC** homepage and click on the **College Library Homepage** link on the left-hand side of the page. From the **Library Services** homepage, click on **Online Databases**, then on the desired database such as the **Delaware Library Catalog**, **Lexis Nexis** or **EBSCOhost** (then on **EBSCOhost Web**).



The **Delaware Library Catalog**, **Lexis Nexis Academic** and many of the **EBSCOhost** databases* can also be accessed from home, via **myDTCC**, by following the procedure below:

1. Go to the Delaware Tech **myDTCC** homepage (<http://my.dtcc.edu>)
2. **Login** with your **username** and **password**
3. Click on the **My Courses** tab at the top of the page
4. Scroll to the bottom of the page where you will see the icons for the different library databases
5. Click on the desired database icon
6. For EBSCOhost, click on **EBSCOhost Web**
7. You are now connected to the database

* The **EBSCOhost** databases **SocINDEX with Full Text** and **Education Research Complete** and **Lexis Nexis Statistical** are not accessible from home.

Database Information

The **Delaware Library Catalog** can be used to search for books, periodical titles, and audiovisual materials from not only the four Delaware Tech libraries but also from Kent and Sussex county public libraries and other academic institutions in the state.

* * *

EBSCOhost is the database service you may find most useful. It contains a variety of databases covering many topics and provides easy access to hundreds of magazines, journals, and other sources, many of which are available in full-text. The list of subject headings and keywords listed in this handout were found using a variety of the databases on *EBSCOhost*.

The databases can be searched individually or together. To search multiple databases at the same time, click on the check boxes to the left of the databases you wish to search then click Continue. If you just want to search one database at a time, click on the name of the database you wish to search. Once in the database, you can enter your search terms.

The databases used in this research guide include:

- **Academic Search Premier**
The world's largest academic multi-disciplinary database, *Academic Search Premier* provides full text for nearly 4,600 scholarly publications, including full text for more than 3,500 peer-reviewed journals. Coverage spans virtually every area of academic study and offers information dating as far back as 1975.
- **ERIC**
ERIC, the Educational Resource Information Center contains more than 2,200 digests along with references for additional information and citations and abstracts from over 980 educational and education-related journals.
- **Education Research Complete (available from Stanton/Wilmington campus computers only)**
Education Research Complete is the definitive online resource for education research. The database covers areas of education, curriculum instruction as well as administration, policy, funding, and related social issues.

Listed below are databases from *EBSCOhost* that are not referenced in this guide but may be useful. They can be searched using the same techniques outlined in this document.

- **Masterfile Premier**
Designed specifically for public libraries, this multidisciplinary database provides full text for more than 2,050 general reference publications with full text information dating as far back as 1975. Covering virtually every subject area of general interest, *MasterFILE Premier* also includes more than 350 full text reference books, 84,606 biographies, 88,463 primary source documents, and an Image Collection of 107,135 photos, maps and flags.
- **SocINDEX with Full Text (available from Owens & Stanton/Wilmington campus computers only)**
This database is the world's most comprehensive and highest quality sociology research database. It contains full text for 344 "core" coverage journals dating back to 1895, and 129 "priority" coverage journals. The database also includes full text for more than 700 books and monographs, and full text for 6,800 conference papers.

- **Business Source Elite**

This business database provides full text for more than 1,100 scholarly business journals, including full text for more than 450 peer-reviewed business publications. There is also access to many company profiles. The rich collection of titles in *Business Source Elite* provides information dating back to 1985.

- **Regional Business News**

This database provides comprehensive full text coverage for regional business publications. *Regional Business News* incorporates coverage of 75 business journals, newspapers and newswires from all metropolitan and rural areas within the United States.

- **Health Source – Nursing/Academic Edition**

This database provides more than 550 scholarly full text journals focusing on many medical disciplines. *Health Source: Nursing/Academic Edition* also features abstracts and indexing for nearly 850 journals.

- **CINAHL with Full Text**

This health related database is the world's most comprehensive source of full text for nursing & allied health journals, providing full text for more than 550 journals. It has more than 600,000 full-text articles dating back to 1982.

Another database service you may wish to consult during the searching process is **Lexis-Nexis**.

- **Lexis-Nexis**

- **Lexis Nexis Academic** provides full-text documents from over 5,900 news, business, legal, medical, and reference publications with a variety of flexible search options.
- **Lexis Nexis Statistical** provides access to statistics produced by federal agencies, states and intergovernmental organizations. **(This database is available from Owens & Stanton/Wilmington campus computers only.)**

You can search statistical tables or click on links to other Web sites with useful information about statistics.

Searching Tips

A **keyword** is a word that appears anywhere (title, abstract, subject heading, etc.) in the text of a record in a catalog, index, or electronic database.

A **subject heading** is a standard word or phrase (also referred to as controlled vocabulary) used to describe and define a concept or thing. Library catalogs, indexes and electronic databases all make use of controlled vocabulary to provide consistent access to books, articles and other material.

A **stopword** is a commonly used word such as an article, pronoun, or preposition. Stopwords are not indexed for searching in the database. For example, 'the', 'for', and 'of' are stopwords. When a stopword is used in a search strategy, it is usually ignored.

Keyword Searching

The easiest way to start searching a database is by entering terms or keywords that describe the information you are looking for. These keywords may or may not be subject headings or the controlled vocabulary that the database recognizes. The database will search all searchable fields (title, abstract, subject headings, etc.) to find the keywords you entered. This method of searching is very general and may retrieve many articles that are relevant but may also produce many that are not. Since the keywords can appear in various search fields, you will have to sort through the results to find the articles that are directly related to the subject you are searching.

- Boolean Connectors

Sometimes a search can be overly general (too many results) or overly specific (too few results). To improve your search, you can use the connectors AND, OR, and NOT to link your search words together. These connectors will help to narrow or broaden your search to better express the terms you are looking for and to retrieve the exact information you need quickly.

- USING THE "AND" CONNECTOR: If you have a search term that is too general, you can connect several terms together using "AND". By adding key terms together, you can define your search and reduce the number of results.
 - For example, **community colleges AND trends** will find results that contain both terms.
- USING THE "OR" CONNECTOR: In order to broaden a search, you can link terms together by using the "OR" connector. By using "OR" to link your terms together you can find documents on many topics. Linked by this connector, your words are searched simultaneously and independently of each other.
 - For example, **community colleges OR two year colleges** will find results that contain either term.
- USING THE "NOT" CONNECTOR: In order to narrow a search, you can link words together by using the "NOT" connector. This connector will help you filter out specific topics you do not wish to include as part of your search.
 - For example, **students NOT on campus students** will find results that contain the term "students", but not the term "on campus students".

Note: Boolean connectors can be used with both keyword and subject searches. See subject searching for an example.

- Parentheses

Parentheses may be used to control a search query. Without parentheses, a search is executed from left to right. Words that you enclose in parentheses are searched first. Why is this important? Parentheses allow you to control and define the way the search will be executed. The left phrase in parentheses is searched first; then based upon those results; the second phrase in parentheses is searched.

Uncontrolled search: **online courses or telecourses and community colleges**

Controlled search: **(online courses or telecourses) and community colleges**

In the first example, the search will produce two types of results. There will be articles that contain the keywords "online courses" by itself and articles that have both the keywords "telecourses" and "community colleges" in them.

In the controlled search, the use of parentheses helps to control the query and to find articles that contain either the keyword "online courses" or "telecourses" AND the keyword "community colleges". It is interpreted by the database as (Online Courses and Community Colleges) OR (Telecourses and Community Colleges).

- Truncation

A truncation symbol can be used to create searches where there could be various endings to your term. You are able to expand your search by searching different forms of a term. Truncation is frequently represented by an asterisk (*) but can vary according to the database. For example, in Lexis Nexis, the truncation symbol is indicated by an exclamation point (!). To truncate a search term, enter the root of the term and then replace the ending with the appropriate symbol.

For example, instruct* will retrieve:

- Instruct
- Instructor
- Instructing
- Instruction, etc.

Subject Searching

- Search Fields

The fields that the database automatically searches when performing an unqualified search or keyword search, are title, subject heading, author and abstract. Qualifying a search by adding a **search field tag** will help you to focus your search more than with keyword searching. The most common search field tag that is shared by most of the databases is DE. In many databases, this is thought to stand for "descriptor". For example, if you wish to search for the subject heading "Access to Education" type **DE Access to Education** in the search box. This tag directs the database to search for that exact subject heading or author-

supplied descriptive keyword for the article. There are other tags that may be of use to you that will be listed under the particular database.

- Boolean Connectors
 - DE Access to Education AND DE Ethnic Groups
 - (DE Ethnic Groups OR DE Minority Groups) AND DE Access to Education AND JN Chronicle of Higher Education

Subject searching as well as keyword searching will retrieve articles that are directly related to your topic. It is very useful to browse subject headings listed in each article. **To see the list of subject headings, click on the title of the article. You can click directly on one of the subject headings to find other articles linked to that subject heading. Alternatively, you can write it down and create a search strategy to search multiple headings.** If you do the latter, remember to use the appropriate search tag so the term(s) will be searched as an exact subject heading.

Using the Keywords and Subject Headings Listed in This Guide

Keyword searching is a good way to begin a search to find relevant subject headings. Suggested keywords and subject headings are listed in this handout to get you started in your searching. This is not a comprehensive list and you may think of other keywords to use that will lead you to subject headings not on the list.

As noted above, when you search using either keywords or subject headings remember to browse subject headings listed in the articles that focus on the topic you are searching.

If you wish to try focused subject searching, use the subject headings listed in this handout. Under each topic, you will find the name of the recommended database(s) and a list of words or phrases along with the appropriate search field tag found in **EBSCOhost**. At any time, you are able to do a quick keyword search in any of the databases by eliminating the search field tag. (If this is done, you will find things that may or may not be relevant to your search.)

Here is a list of the most common search field tags used in **EBSCOhost**. Most of the following tags will appear in your handout as well as others that do not appear in this list.

DE - searches for an exact subject heading

GE - searches for a geographic term

TX - searches for keywords found in all searchable fields

JN - searches for a specific journal or magazine title

The databases are not case sensitive but are character and space sensitive. When using the “DE” search field tag, type the subject headings exactly as you see it, including any spaces or dashes. These two examples will yield the same results:

- DE Health Behavior -- Age Factors (spaces around the dashes)
- DE health behavior -- age factors (spaces around the dashes)

These two examples would not produce any results because these are not exact subject headings recognized by the database:

- DE health behavior--age factors (no spaces around the dashes)
- DE health behavior age factors (no dashes)

Using the Boolean connectors, you can combine several terms within the list to create a search strategy. For example: (DE Trends or DE Forecasting) and TX Immigration.

Searching the databases (EBSCOhost & LexisNexis)

1. EBSCOhost

- a. ERIC
- b. Education Research Complete (Stanton/Wilmington Campus Computers only)
- c. Academic Search Premier

The search field tags that can be used in ERIC are **DE** (exact subject heading), **DM** (proper names or specific terms identifying the subject - i.e. states, schools), and **JN** (journal name).

The search tags that can be used in Academic Search Premier and Education Research Complete are **DE** (exact subject heading), **GE** (geographic terms), and **TX** (keywords found in all searchable fields).

Examples of the search interface can be found on the next page.

When searching the EBSCOhost databases, you are able to limit to Full Text and Scholarly Journals from the search screen. There are other limits listed in the “Limit your results” section including publication name, publication date, and number of pages.



Searching the Delaware Library Catalog

The default quick search screen is set to keyword / words or phrases, which will search the entire record (title, subject, author, etc.) for your keyword(s). The best way to start searching the catalog is with a **keyword / subject search**. This will search the subject headings for your keyword(s). You can start with using some of the same keywords and subject headings listed above.

From the search screen, you are able to select from which **library** you want your results to come from, whether it is your specific campus library or all of the Delaware Tech libraries. You can even expand it to all of the libraries in the catalog. By selecting ALL, this will allow you to see any of the e-books that contain your keywords as well.

You are able to expand or limit your search by performing a subject heading search. If you find a book that is directly related to your topic, try searching by one of the subject headings listed. You can do this by clicking on the specific subject heading. For example, Educational technology--Planning will find all of the items with this specific subject heading attached to it.

You can also **browse** by **subject** to see list of subject headings on your topic.


Check the Item Information tab for the holdings at your specific library. Some periodicals have issues devoted to specific subjects. In these cases, the issues may be cataloged separately as books.

Placing Holds for Items at Other Libraries

If you find an item that is located at a different library, you are able to place a hold on that item and have it sent to your campus library for pick up. To place a hold, you must have a Delaware Tech library barcode on the back of your ID as well as a PIN. You are able to obtain both the barcode and PIN at your campus library. You can place a hold from either the Search Results screen or on the Full Record screen.
